Although no prior education or experience with trucks is required to enroll in the CDL program, students must meet driver qualifications set forth by the Bureau of Motor Carrier Safety and pass the physical examination requirements established by the Department of Transportation. Specifically, students must:

- Possess a high school diploma or GED
- Be 18 years of age or older with a valid driver's license and safe driving record
- Communicate in the English language sufficiently, as required by the US Department of Transportation
- · Successfully complete a Department of Transportation (DOT) physical, which cannot expire during the training period
- Successfully pass a DOT federal drug screen
